Substitutions

Under 12 - Under 16 Leagues inclusive: A maximum of five substitutes will be allowed. These substitutes may be used at any time with the permission of the Referee. A player who has been replaced may return to the playing area as a substitute for another player.

Match Days - Remember if any of the details below change affecting your match you must do the following:

Ground change: notify the away team and the Referee

Kit change: notify the away team (just in case of a colour clash)

REFEREE APPOINTMENTS

Referees are appointed by the League Referees' Secretary for the following:

Under 12, 15 and 16 - Qualified Referees will be appointed where possible to all League games in these age groups. Please check with the League Referees' Secretary before your match just in case a Referee has not been appointed.

Cup Games - All Games will be appointed a qualified Referee by the League Referee's Secretary. Where the League Referees' Secretary has been unable to appoint a Referee by the Friday before your match, you will be notified. It will then be the responsibility of the Home Club to ensure a qualified referee is appointed.

ASSISTANT REFEREES

Each Club must provide an Assistant Referee before the game and having taken instructions from the Referee will assist him / her during the game.

MATCH RESULTS

Both HOME and AWAY teams will communicate by SMS text messaging the result directly to the FA Full-Time messaging service on the day of the match no later than 8pm.

MATCH REPORT FORMS

All Match Report Forms should be forwarded to the Results Secretary **within three days of the fixture being played**. Remember both the Home and Away teams must submit a Match Report Form.

PLAYER REGISTRATIONS

Clubs will be issued with a registration document upon which clubs may sign players. Each registration costs £2.50.

To register a player who has not been registered within the League before, his / her registration form must be accompanied by a copy of his / her Birth Certificate. Each player must also provide a passport sized photograph. This will be placed on a team passport which must be available for inspection at every match. Clubs will pay £10.00 for each additional or replacement team passport.

Initially, each team must provide a minimum of 7 completed registration forms for mini-soccer and a minimum of 8 completed registration forms for 11-a-side. These must be received by the League no later than 16th July.

Following this any additional registrations must be forwarded to the Secretary at least 5 days before a match in which they want a player to participate. A player can not play until an updated team passport has been received.

- ***Mondays for Saturday matches***
- ***Tuesdays for Sunday matches***

All registrations are to be completed by the 31st March. After this date, registrations will only be allowed at the discretion of the Management Committee.

REGISTRATION AGE GROUPS

Under 9: Players must have attained the age of 8 but must be under the age of 9 on the 31st August

Under 10: Players must be over 8 and under 10 on the 31st August

Under 11: Players must be over 9 and under 11 on the 31st August

Under 12: Players must be over 11 and under 12 on the 31st August

Under 13: Players must be over 11 and under 13 on the 31st August

Under 14: Players must be over 12 and under 14 on the 31st August

Under 15: Players must be over 13 and under 15 on the 31st August

Under 16: Players must be over 14 and under 16 on the 31st August

PLAYER TRANSFERS

How to request to transfer a player

- A Club wishing to sign a player who is already registered with another Club in the League shall not approach the player, except during the period **1st June to the 30th June** inclusive without at least seven days notice in writing to the Secretary for the Club for which that player is registered.
- Send a letter of the intent to approach, giving at least seven days notice, to the Secretary of the Club to which the player is registered.
- **Also send a copy of that letter to the Secretary** who shall send you the appropriate transfer form.
- On receiving the form, **complete it fully** remembering to get the **Player's, Parent/Guardian's and former manager's signatures**.
- Once complete return the form to the Secretary accompanied with a transfer fee of £25.00. The transfer must be completed within 21 days of the form being received.
- A player can not play until an updated team passport has been received.

SPECIAL CHAMPIONSHIP DECIDING MATCHES

A player shall not be eligible to play for a team in a special championship deciding match unless he / she has played three games for that team in the current season.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

For a player to play in the final tie of any Cup competition he / she must have played in one previous round of that competition.

In the Cups there are no replays. If the score is level at full time, extra time is to be played. If it is still level after the extra time has been completed, kicks from the penalty mark shall decide the tie.

Referees will be appointed to ALL Cup games **where possible**.

HOW TO REQUEST A POSTPONEMENT OF A FIXTURE

If your pitch is unfit (waterlogged, frozen etc)

- To request a postponement the pitch **must have been inspected by a qualified Referee** not more than 24 hours before the game is to be played.
- If unfit then the Home Club must do the following in the order below:
 - 1. Notify the Results and Registrations Secretary**
 - 2. Notify the League Referees' Secretary (if a Referee is usually appointed to your games)**
 - 3. Notify the Secretary or Manager of the Club you were due to be playing**
 - 4. Notify the Referee**
- If you play your games on a Council owned pitch and they call off the game, follow the above procedure for postponing your match.

If you can not play your game due to school commitments

- You must let the Results and Registrations Secretary know in writing at least fourteen days prior to the scheduled date that you can't play your game. **A minimum of four players must be involved to postpone the game. Details of the player's involvement in the activity must be provided as soon as possible to the League Secretary.**
- You must also let the League Referee's Secretary, Opposition and the Referee know of the postponement.
- If you use council pitches, remember to cancel your pitch otherwise you will be charged for it.
- If you can not provide the evidence that your players were involved in school activities, the League may consider taking the appropriate action.

If you have to postpone your game for any other reason, it will be regarded, as a non-fulfilment of fixture and the League shall decide if any action against your Club is warranted.

Cup Matches

If you need to request to postpone a Cup match for legitimate reasons such as school commitments follow the procedure above. However, if a satisfactory reason for the postponement is not forthcoming, the fixture will be deemed as a non-fulfilment and your Club may be scratched from the competition.

Non-fulfilment of fixtures

For all proven cases of non-fulfilment by a team, a minimum fine of £15.00 will be levied together with an automatic deduction of three (3) points from the offending team's total.

In all age groups, a third offence may result in the team being expelled from the League and forfeiture of its Goodwill Deposit.

Withdrawals from the League

All clubs must indicate their intention to withdrawal from the League in writing to the League Secretary by 31st March in the current season or may be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.00.

No club will be allowed to withdrawal any or all of its teams from the Competition after the Annual General Meeting. Any club infringing this Rule shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £100.00.

HOW TO BECOME A REFEREE

The Herefordshire Football Association runs Referee's courses several times throughout the year. The course is run by the Herefordshire Football Association's group of Referee's instructors.

The course is undertaken over a total of approximately 15 hours and to pass the course there is a verbal and written examination.

INSURANCE AND DISCLAIMER

The Herefordshire Junior Football League will not be held liable for any injury, accidental or otherwise. Under Herefordshire Football Association rules, we are only able to allow affiliated teams to compete, meaning they shall be covered through the Association's Public Liability Insurance. We have been advised that due to the lack of adequate insurance for children under 18, we would suggest that individual players be covered by their own family insurance.

CODES OF CONDUCT

The following Codes of Conduct have been released as part of the FA Respect Campaign. There are Codes of Conduct for Players, Coaches, Team Officials and Parents / Spectators. The Herefordshire Junior Football League fully supports all of the Codes and asks all Member Clubs to obey them so everyone especially the players are allowed to enjoy the best game in the world.

Code of Conduct: Young Players

It is important everyone behaves themselves when playing football.

As a player, you have a big part to play. That's why The FA is asking every player to follow a Respect Code of Conduct.

When playing football, I will:

- Always do my best, even if we're losing or the other team is stronger
- Play fairly - I won't cheat, complain or waste time
- Never be rude to my team-mates, the other team, the referee, spectators or my coach/team manager
- Do what the referee tells me
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen to my coach/team manager and respect what he/she says
- Talk to someone I trust, for example my parents or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club.

I understand that if I do not follow the code, action may be taken.

The captain's role

As your team's captain, you have a vital role to play in helping us achieve the number one priority for footballers in The FA's biggest-ever survey of grassroots football - a referee for every game.

Captain taking responsibility

As a captain, you have no special status or privileges under the Laws of the Game, but you do have a degree of responsibility for the behaviour of your team.

To promote Respect, the referee will work with you, as the team captain, to manage the players and the game effectively.

Even if you are some way away from an incident when the referee feels he/she needs you involved in a discussion with a player, the referee will call you over. This will ensure that, as the team captain, you remain the point of contact for the referee.

How Captains can help to instill Respect:

- Ensure you wear a Respect captain's armband - these will be provided by your league to your club
- Together with your opposition captain, make yourself known to the referee before the game. He/she will ask if you are clear about your responsibilities
- Ensure all your players understand what they can/cannot do in relation to the referee and what is meant by 'unwanted behaviour'. No-one's trying to curb enthusiasm - just instill more discipline. This can only benefit your match - and football as a whole
- Ensure your vice-captain (appoint one if you haven't got one) is aware of these rules, in case you are unavailable for a game, or have to leave the field
- Ensure every player in your team has signed the Respect Code of Conduct

Code of Conduct: Parents/Spectators

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers at all times.

I will:

- Remain outside the field of play and behind the Designated Spectator Area (where provided)
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success

In addition, when attending youth games I will:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Let the coaches do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition and match officials
- Never criticise a player for making a mistake -mistakes are part of learning

I understand that breaches of the code may result in action being taken by my County FA and /or The FA

Code of Conduct: Coaches

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for coaches, team managers and club officials at all times.

I will:

- Show respect to others involved in the game including match officials, opposition players, coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Adhere to the Laws of the Game
- Display and promote high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Never enter the field of play without the referee's permission
- Never engage in public criticism of the match officials
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.

When working with players, I will:

- Place the well-being, safety and enjoyment of each player above everything, including winning
- Explain exactly what I expect of players and what they can expect from me
- Ensure the parents/carers of all players under the age of 18 understand these expectations
- Refrain from, and refuse to tolerate any form of bullying
- Develop mutual trust and respect with every player to build their self-esteem
- Encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure all activities I organise are appropriate for the players' ability level, experience, age and maturity
- Co-operate fully with others in football (e.g. officials, doctors, physiotherapists, welfare officers) for each player's best interests

I understand that breaches of the code may result in action being taken by my County FA and /or The FA.

The Football Association - A Code of Conduct for Football

Football is the national game. All those involved with the game at every level and whether as a player, match official, coach, owner or administrator, have a responsibility, above and beyond compliance with the law, to act according to the highest standards of integrity, and to ensure that the reputation of the game is, and remains, high. This code applies to all those involved in football under the auspices of The Football Association.

Community

Football, at all levels, is a vital part of a community. Football will take into account community feeling when making decisions.

Equality

Football is opposed to discrimination of any form and will promote measures to prevent it, in whatever form, from being expressed.

Participants

Football recognises the sense of ownership felt by those who participate at all levels of the game. This includes those who play, those who coach or help in any way, and those who officiate, as well as administrators and supporters. Football is committed to appropriate consultation.

Young People

Football acknowledges the extent of its influence over young people and pledges to set a positive example.

Propriety

Football acknowledges that public confidence demands the highest standards of financial and administrative behaviour within the game, and will not tolerate corruption or improper practices.

Trust and Respect

Football will uphold a relationship of trust and respect between all involved in the game, whether they are individuals, clubs or other organisations.

Violence

Football rejects the use of violence of any nature by anyone involved in the game.

Fairness

Football is committed to fairness in its dealings with all involved in the game.

Integrity and Fair Play

Football is committed to the principle of playing to win consistent with Fair Play.

THE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION
CHILD PROTECTION POLICY STATEMENT

Every child or young person who plays or participates in football should be able to take part in an enjoyable and safe environment and be protected from abuse. This is the responsibility of every adult involved in football. The Football Association recognises its responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people by protecting them from physical, sexual or emotional harm and from neglect or bullying. It is determined to meet its obligations to ensure that those clubs and organisations providing football opportunities for children and young people do so, to the highest possible standard of care. (Appendix 1 - The Football Association Regulations)

These procedures apply to anyone in football whether in a paid or voluntary capacity. For example, volunteers in clubs, club officials, helpers on club tours, football coaches and medical staff. The Football Association will consider, having taken advice, whether anyone who has a previous criminal conviction or caution for offences related to the abuse of children or young people, violence or any sexual offences should be excluded from working with children and young people. This position is re-enforced by U.K. legislation and guidance.

The Herefordshire Junior Football League incorporates all aspects of The Football Association Child Protection Policy into its own Constitution, Rules and Regulations.

TEAM TOGETHER

LET'S KICK RACISM OUT OF FOOTBALL

Herefordshire Junior Football League supports the aims and objectives of the 'Let's Kick Racism Out of Football' campaign.

As the world's most popular sport football allows us to show unity between different communities. Despite this, many players from ethnic minorities continue to face abuse and harassment whilst playing the game.

Players, referees and administrators are reminded that racial abuse on the field of play is a red card offence. Clubs, leagues or individuals who exclude, abuse or harass because of race or religion will face having their registration cancelled.

Players suffering racial abuse are encouraged to report it to referees on the field of play and to the Secretary or Chairman of their League. The County should also be informed immediately.

We all have a responsibility to tackle racism in football.
